Epic Wireless Group Presentation

At the February 8 Board of Directors meeting staff shared a written proposal from Epic Wireless Group, a consultant working with AT&T, to place a cell tower within the boundaries of Sierra Creek Park. After frank discussion and feedback from the Board, staff was directed by vote to contact Epic Wireless for further information on the proposal. Staff contacted Epic on 2/29. As part of the discussion, they were asked if they had considered other District facilities as a possible location for a tower, and shared information on the Capehart Park and Gymnasium complex as a possible alternate site based on existing infrastructure and close proximity to Sierra Creek. Coincidentally, Epic had explored Capehart as a venue and reached out to Sacramento Suburban Water District in the recent the past to put an antenna on the existing water tower. That project was not feasible and Epic moved on. They were intrigued to find out that NHRPD controls most of that property and stated the site met a lot of requirements as a location on their end. Staff met with Epic representatives on-site on March 5 and discussed possible locations for consideration.

Ashley Smith, Site Acquisition Manager for Epic, will be at the March 14 Board meeting to make a presentation to the Board on this option. Included in your meeting materials is information from Epic for your further review.

Additional ARPA Funding

Staff was recently approached by staff from Sacramento County and Supervisor Sue Frost's office about the possible addition of ARPA funds for District projects. The amount of possible funding is \$211,000, which is addition to the previously approved \$200,000 funding for the Planehaven Park project. I would like to suggest that a standing committee meeting involving

staff and the Facility Development Committee be scheduled to discuss this opportunity, as well as the cell tower project, sometime the week of March 25, depending on committee member availability. Both topics can then be brought to the full Board on April 11 for consideration and possible action.

CSDA Board of Directors Nomination Timeline

Staff received correspondence from CSDA outlining the timeline and nomination process for the 2024 Board of Directors, seat A. As part of the nomination procedures, the member district must submit either a Board resolution or minute action approving consideration of any and all candidates. The deadline for submittal for those documents is April 10, 2024. Unfortunately, our April Board meeting is scheduled on April 11. I contacted CSDA on this matter and will share one possible option for our Board members if they are interested in pursuing a Board spot with CSDA.

FEC Police Department Update

Staff attended an informational meeting on the current status of the Fulton-El Camino Police Department. I can share with you that their two-year study on this matter has concluded and their next step will be reporting to the proper FEC standing committee and then their full Board. No timeline for that process was shared.

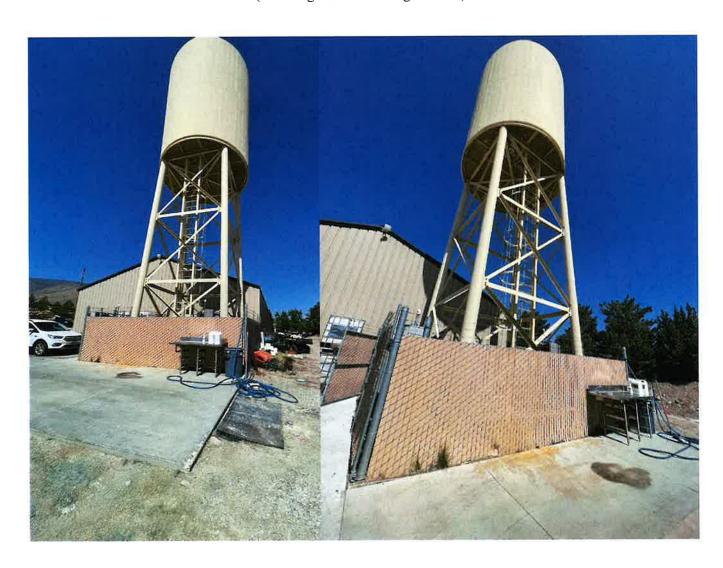

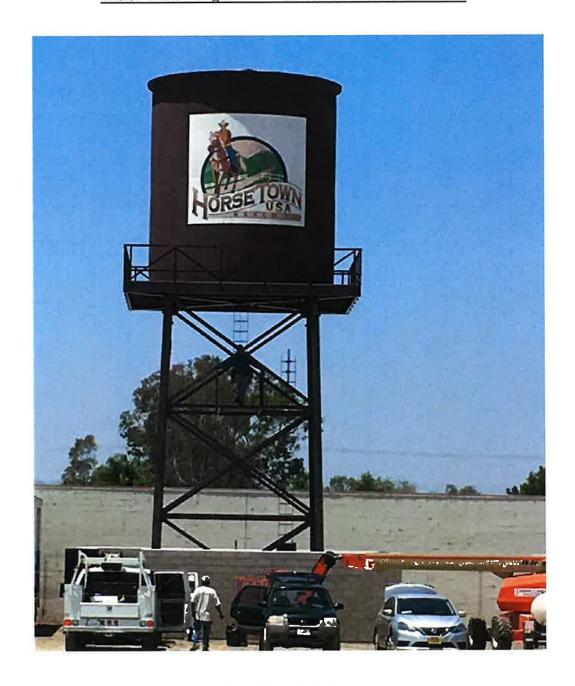

BENEFITS OF PROPOSED TOWER:

This Facility is intended to fill a significant gap in AT&T's high band 4G LTE coverage experienced by its customers in a targeted coverage area of Sacramento County.

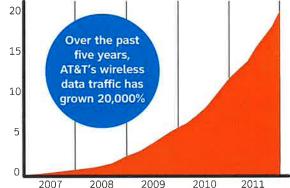
The Number of California Wireless Users is Growing

• At more than 33 million, California leads the nation with more wireless consumers than any other state. And they depend on wireless service for their tablets, netbooks, picture frames, eReaders, cameras and even their cars. Wireless technology is now ingrained into Californians' on-the-go lifestyles.

The Way Californians' Use Wireless Devices Has Changed in Dramatic Ways:

Technology has evolved and Californians now use wireless devices to watch movies, read newspapers, read books, listen to music and consume other media.

- In the last five years, wireless data on AT&T's network has grown by 20,000 percent.
- 44 percent of African-Americans and Latinos are smartphone users.2

- More than four in 10 (43 percent) small businesses report all of their employees use wireless devices or technologies to work away from the office, a **nearly 80 percent jump** over the past three years.
- Despite being a relatively new technology device, two-thirds (67 percent) of small businesses indicate that they use tablet computers, up from 57 percent a year ago.

PARK MAINTENANCE UPDATE:

Staff completed the following tasks

- Cleared out downed branches and debris from storms.
- Repaired two different irrigation leaks at Freedom Park (one 6" main break & two 2" leaking valves).
- Repainted and touched up all "welcome to park" signs.
- Signed LOA with Sheriff Department for parks. LOA stand for Letter of Agreement, which means we are
 agreeing that the sheriffs can enter our property when we aren't there on our behalf. For situations
 like trespassing or other after hour park emergencies.
- Installed new female ended coupler on bobcat hydraulic line for the backhoe attachment.
- Rotated both 2021 Ford F150s through dealer for safety recalls. The recalls included replacing potentially faulty brake line to rear axle, and both rear blinker wiring.
- Serviced both riding mowers.
- Internally trained full time maintenance staff how to administer Naloxone, we pulled all information from cdc.ca.gov website. Sacramento Opioid Foundation donated 16 boxes of Naloxone. Naloxone is the medical term for Narcan which is the nasal spray used for opioid overdose. We are also working with Sacramento County to do a formal training in the near future for all staff.

FACILITY MAINTENANCE UPDATE:

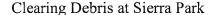
- Hung sponsorship banners at Capehart.

- On 2/26 there was a homeless encampment on the corner Scotland Drive. Staff asked the people to leave, which they did. On the morning of the 27th the encampment was back and we alerted the Sheriffs of the camp's location and asked them to intervene.

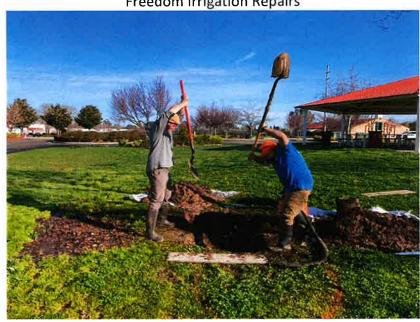

To be eligible for a scholarship, applicants must meet specific criteria, including:

Scholarships are restricted to residents of the NHRPD.

Approximately 3000 residents of North Highlands that live outside the District boundaries cannot be considered for a scholarship. It has been proposed that all residents with a 95660 address should be eligible for a scholarship (if all other requirements are met) in addition to residents that currently reside within NHRPD boundaries with zip codes of 95842 and 95843 that are already considered eligible for a District scholarship.

RECOMMENDATION

The Board approves the revision of Policy 3050.10 to expand scholarship eligibility to all residents that live within the community boundaries of North Highlands (95660).

BACKGROUND

The District requires further transfers from the Contingency Fund to support various General Fund budget accounts. There are five total Contingency Fund line items; four located in the General Fund budget and one in the CFD (Elverta Park) budget. The purpose of the Contingency Fund is to support additional unforeseen district financial needs throughout the fiscal year.

DISCUSSION

The District anticipates a need for additional funds to be transferred from the Contingency Fund to four GF operational accounts and one CFD (Elverta Park) operational account. The transfer requests are listed below by division.

ADMINISTRATION DIVISION

Increase to Sacramento County Accounting Services

Account: 2505

Accounting fees charged by Sacramento County have been increased over the last nine months.

Funding Request: \$1,400

ADMINISTRATION DIVISION SUB-TOTAL REQUEST \$1,400

MAINTENANCE DIVISION

Increase to Equipment Account

Account: 4303

The Board of Directors approved the 2023-24 Fiscal Year Budget which included funding in the amount of \$40,000 for the purchase of a new truck for the Maintenance fleet. Staff has identified the truck that best fits the District's needs, a 2024 Ram Tradesman 4x2 Crew Cab ¾ ton truck with the tow capacity to safely pull the heaviest of payloads the Maintenance division would need. The lowest bid price we have received for the truck is \$43,694 plus license and registration, for an anticipated total cost of no more than \$50,000.

Funding Request: \$10,000

Increase to Building Improvement Account

Account: 4201

After the latest in a series of heavy rain storms the Community Center was leaking in multiple areas. It is not uncommon for the south side of the building to be susceptible to leaking during heavy rain combined with high winds. The recent leaks were in locations not previously prone to leaks. Staff brought in a roof contractor to thoroughly inspect the roofs over both the Community Center and Office building. Both roofs are in dire need of replacement. We are waiting for quotes to replace both roofs, but short term would like to complete repairs on the community center to mitigate the leaks and get past the rainy season. The quoted price was \$20,000 for repairs, and should we move forward in replacing that roof in future budget cycles the contractor will subtract that amount from the cost to replace the existing roof.

Funding Request: \$ 20,000

Increase to Water Account

Account 2198

Over the last nine months the District has seen an average rate increase of 10% from our two water providers (Cal/Am Water and Sacramento Suburban Water District). Combined with these rate increases, we also experienced three serious main line breaks and 10 less severe leaks in District parks. These incidents can drive up water use, even during the months irrigation to the parks has been turned off. As a result, it is necessary to make a contingency transfer request to address water expenditures for the next four months that impact both the General Fund budget and the CFD budget (Elverta Park).

Recreation staff was recently introduced to David Sobon, the Director of a non-profit organization called Wide Open Walls. Their purpose is to pair local artists with organizations and locations throughout the region to paint murals as a way to beautify schools, businesses, parks and other open spaces. Staff was intrigued by the opportunity to partner with Wide Open Walls on projects now and in the future (Sierra Creek Park, Freedom Park, Ruth Inman and more). Their CEO, working with Recreation Superintendent Robertson, has identified Karl Rosario as a potential mural site. As the Board is aware, Karl Rosario has a long, relatively low wall that would lend itself to a mural to help celebrate the neighborhood in particular and NHRPD in general, as it will lead to future collaborations. Wide Open Walls procures supplies and materials and works with local artists to paint the murals. They have identified an artist that lives in the Karl Rosario neighborhood to complete the project. Staff would like to establish this relationship now as opposed to July, as Wide Open Walls has several projects already scheduled for spring all the way through next fall. The requested amount would cover the artist's fees and any materials needed.
